



#### 2 Timothy 4:7-8

I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing.

Christian Atsu Twasam popularly known as Christian Atsu, was born on the 10th January, 1992 at Kyeiamanfro, Kwahu in the Eastern Region to Jonah Akami Twasam and Sarah Afiko Dzuvor all of blessed memory. He later moved to madina with his mother and other siblings where he begun his primary education at the La Nkwanta primary school in Madina. During his early school days at Madina, he was known by his peers as "Devioo" (little) due to his diminutive stature among the big boys he was playing with. A name he was still called by his close peers even after he became a professional footballer. At an early age of about 5, his football talent was so evident and his late father use to tell everybody his son will be the next big player in Ghana.





A prophecy he did not live to see come to pass. Nevertheless Papa indeed your son also chart his own course and left his legacy on this beautiful sands of time. He started his football career with Peace Boys Football club. A colts team at Achimota, Accra. By age ten, he was scouted by the Coach of the then Ga District under 12 football team to represent the district in the greater Accra under 12 inter district football competition that was hosted in Tema when he was playing for La Nkwanta Primary School. Even though the Ga district team came as the runner up of the competition, Atsu won the best player of that tournament and was subsequently chosen to represent greater Accra in the national milo under 12 championship in Kumasi. Before the tournament in Kumasi, he was seen by scouts of Feyenoord Fetteh Football Academy in one of his games for Peace Boys Football Club at Achimota, Accra and was picked for further trials at their academy in Gomoa Fetteh. But as fate will have it. The same scouts were at Kumasi to watch the national milo under 12 tournament to scout for other players. During one of the training sessions for the greater Accra team, the scouts decided to pick him and make final arrangement for his permanent transfer to the academy instead of opting for a further trials. His Parents were consulted and Atsu was officially allowed to join the academy at the age of 11.

That was the beginning of his football education at the Feyenoord Fetteh Football Academy. During his time at the academy, he continued with his formal education and was admitted at the Potsin T.I Ahmadiya Senior High School in the Central Region for the 2007/2008 Academic year. He was the only form one student to play for the school team in the 2008 National Milo Championship for second cycle schools in the then Brong Ahafo region, where he was awarded the best attacker of the tournament. Atsu won the best player awards in tournaments Feyenoord participated in in South Africa, The Netherlands, Belgium, Mali, Niger and Burkina Faso. An enviable record he made for himself at the Academy. It wasn't long Scouts within Europe

and Africa came calling eager to get him to clubs in Europe. In 2009, Ramp management lead by their chief scout, Graham Heydorn secured a deal for Atsu at Portuguese giant F.C Porto, but due to him being under age, he will leave Feyenoord Fetteh Academy for Cheetah F.C at Kasoa, in the Central Region till he turned 18 years in January 2010 when he left the shores of Ghana for F.C Porto in Porto, Portugal.

He joined the youth ranks of F.C Porto and continued with his hard work with the youth team. He won several awards including the Adidas Best Player Award at the Blue Stars/FIFA Youth Cup Tournament in Zurich, Switzerland in 2011. On 14 May 2011, he was called by the then first team manager Andre Villas Boas into the first team for a match against Maritimo, but was an unused substitute. Atsu, never returned to the youth ranks and was made a permanent first team player. At the end of the 2010/2011 season, F.C Porto sent him on a season long loan at fellow Portuguese Primeira Liga Club, Rio Ave for the upcoming 2011/2012 season. He made his debut for Rio Ave on 28 August 2011, in a 0–1 home loss against Olhanense. On 16 December 2011, Atsu opened the score at Estadia do luz against F.C Porto's bitter rivals Benfica in the 24th minute. He made 27 appearances for Rio Ave and scored 6 goals for the 2011/2012 season. He was adjudged the best player for Rio Ave for the 2011/2012 season. He will return to his mother club FC Porto for the 2012/2013 season.

F.C Porto won the 2012/2013 Primeira Liga title and Atsu was very instrumental in that campaign starting almost most of the league games and the UEFA Champions league. He had and excellent season, by the time the season was coming to close in 2013, it was rumoured that a lot of big clubs within Europe was after his signature. Chelsea Football Club reportedly brought the rumours to an end by signing him for an amount believe to be in the region of £3.5 million and was immediately loaned to Dutch club Vitesse Arnhem for the 2013–14 season.





Atsu made his debut against Feyenoord as a substitute on October 6th 2013. He went on to providing an assist for Vitesse only goal of the match. That was indeed a shadow of what was to come for the season. Atsu played a total of 30 games in all competition for Vitesse and scored 5 goals for the Dutch side as they finished 6th in the league. This lead to the team qualifying for the playoff. By the end of the 2013/2014 season, he was voted the Vitesse's player of the season. he returned to his mother club, chelsea football club where he will also have loan spells at fellow premier league club, Everton for the 2014/2015 season, Bournemouth for the 2015/2016 and Malaga in the Spanish Top flight La liga for the 2015/2016 season. Injuries hampered his season and he could not perform to his maximum abilities as he used to.

He fully recovered for the 2016/2017 season and was loaned again to Newcastle United. There he made almost 32 appearances for Newcastle United as they won the championship gaining promotion to the English top flight the premier league. Newcastle signed him on permanent basis at the end of the 2016/2017 season on a four years contract where he will spent a total of five years at Newcastle United making him a fan favourite and a cult hero at the James Park.

By the time his contract came to end in 2021, he entered the free agency and moved to Saudi pro league club, Al-Raed in Saudi Arabia for the 2021/2022 season. But due to injuries, his playing time was limited. At the beginning of the 2022/2023 season, he signed an initial one year contract for Turkish Super big club Hataypor on 6th September 2022. There he was still battling with injuries until the end of january 2023 when he was fully declared fit to compete. On the 5th of February 2023, he came on as a late substitute to score the only goal of the match in the seventh minute of added time to rescue the club from going on relegation.

In June 2012, coach Kwesi Appiah the then coach of the senior national team the black stars gave Atsu his call up to the national team. On his debut against Lesotho at the Babayara Sports Stadium, he score in the process and from that time became an integral part of coach Kwesi Appiah's team and subsequent coaches of the senior national team. He was in the Ghana squad for the 2013 Africa Cup of Nations in South Africa. He scored the second goal of Ghana's 3-0 win against Niger in Port Elizabeth. Atsu featured in the rest of the games as Ghana came fourth in the tournament in South Africa 2013.

In 2014, Atsu was selected for the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil. He started all the matches for Ghana, Ghana was eliminated in the group stage of the world cup. In 2015 Atsu was selected for the 2015 Africa Cup of Nations tournament. Ghana lost to Ivory Coast in the final. Atsu won three man of the match at the tournament. He was adjudged the player of the tournament and the his strike against Guinea was also adjudged the goal of the tournament. He participated in the 2017 and 2019 Africa Nations Cup in Gabon and Egypt respectively. He won one man of the match award at the 2017 tournaments, but his 2019 Nations Cup ended early as he sustained an injury during the opening game. In all Atsu made 65 appearances for the senior national team.

Atsu was actively involve in charity and philanthropic work. These are things he did without letting it known to the public domain. He was an ambassador for arms Around the Child, an organisation supporting disadvantaged children and also an ambassador for Crime Check Foundation, an organisation dedicated to crime prevention advocacy, petty offenders' project, health check series, philanthropy and exconvict reintegration project.

Atsu was married to Marie Claire Rupio and was blessed with two sons Joshua Christian Twasam, Godwin Twasam and a daughter Abigail Twasam.

Rest well my brother. Rest well Atsu.

Throughout his career, Atsu interacted with many well-meaning Ghanaians and international partners at both personal and professional levels. His first close interaction with the Ministryof Sports, was his first call up to the Black Stars in 2012. His stellar performance with the Black Stars, right from his debut match against Lesotho on 1st June 2012 at the Baba Yara Sports Stadium in Kumasi, endeared him to many Ghanaians. A new Black Star was born that day, no doubt.

As one of the youngest players of the team, with much expectation from Ghanaians, he exhibited beyond the talents and skills known to many, when he scored the fifth goal in the Black Stars' seven-goal thrashing of Lesotho. Indeed, the BBC described him as an "excellent prospect", "quick and technically

impressive" player with high potential in the National team.

Atsu continued to serve Ghana through the Black Stars in many assignments, including, the African Cup of Nations in South Africa, 2013, Equatorial Guinea 2015, Gabon 2017 and Egypt in 2019. He also represented Ghana at the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil.

His most memorable performance with the Black Stars was at the 2015 Afcon in Equatorial Ghana, where he won the Player of the Tournament, after his excellent performance helped the Black Stars to reach the grand finale.

In all the Ministry's interactions with the Black Stars, Atsu always displayed calmness, an attribute his mates have attested to.

His acclaimed humane nature, friendliness, love for people, commitment to mother Ghana and team spirit were exceptional and deserve emulation. Even at the peak of his career, Atsu remained himself and was never overtaken by pride, arrogance and indiscipline.

On the occasion of mourning our son, brother and colleague, we believe that Christian Atsu graciously paid his dues to Mother Ghana and memories of his commitment and contributions to the National team, the Black Stars, will forever remain in the minds of both present and future generations.

His legacy will remain as an inspiration for the Black Stars, the football fraternity and generally, the youth of our country, Ghana.

We pray that our brother, our son and our Black Star, finds the best place with the Lord.

You were always so full of life.



But as you always say, God win. In Love, your wife.


























We missed you dad,

hristian Atsu Twasam, affectionately called "Ayigbe Messi" by his teammates and the football community made an instant impact the very moment he was called up to the Black Stars on June 1, 2012. Atsu did not only score on his debut but went on to play 65 matches and scored 9 goals for Ghana. He played in four Africa Cup of Nations tournaments and one FIFA World Cup in 2014 in Brazil. Christian was adjudged the best player at the 2015 Africa Cup of Nations in Equatorial Guinea where Ghana lost to Ivory Coast to finish second. Atsu was also named in the Team of the Tournament for the 2017 Africa Cup of Nations in Gabon, where Ghana came fourth.

He was born to make an impact and bring joy into many homes, not only in Ghana but also across the ocean.

Christian was described by the BBC as an "excellent prospect", whilst ESPN added he was "quick and

technically impressive», and a potential future star for his national team.

Christian, we don't know why you had to endure that kind of torture and pain before leaving us, but we know we will miss you. With your happy smile and sense of fun, we can't take it in that you are gone. You brought joy to every life you touched and made a difference wherever you found yourself. But a beautiful soul lives on forever, and we will always treasure and cherish memories of you.

Described by The Guardian obituary writer Louise Taylor as "a true Christian in every sense of the word", Christian was active in charity, being an ambassador for Arms around the Child, an organization supporting disadvantaged children as he also paid thousands of pounds of bail money to free Ghanaians who had been jailed.

Christian Atsu was loved by his teammates, technical team members, close associates, people in management positions, and even onlookers and supporters.

He was such a model and example to us of how we ought to care for and love one another on this side of life, cheerful and in good spirits even when times were hard. For this, he will be greatly missed.

Christian Atsu Twasam was a source of hope and inspiration for the oppressed and downtrodden in the football fraternity and society at large. Many young footballers looked up to him as a source of inspiration following his touching journey from the dusts of Kasoa to the pastures of Porto in Portugal, resulting in a career that spanned 13 years before his sad departure. He played his role as an excellent football ambassador everywhere he played i.e., Portugal, the Netherlands, Spain, England, Saudi Arabia, and Turkey





His excellent personality and work ethic on the football pitch always showed profoundly.

Rest well Christian, may the angels sing thee to thy eternal rest in Abraham's bosom and may the Lord's face eternally shine upon you until we meet again.

A true football warrior, a gentleman, an icon, a true philanthropist, an issue-oriented person and a farsighted man has left us.

We know he is in a good place and having a peaceful rest with his maker. May you rest in the peace you so richly deserve until we meet again.

### **VITESSE**





fter a period of uncertainty and worry Vitesse have received the heartbreaking confirmation that Christian Atsu died in the tragic earthquake in Turkey and Syria. The Ghanaian attacker had just turned 31 years old. Our thoughts are with the family and friends of the former Vitesse player.

How thin the line can be between joy and great sorrow has become so sadly clear. Where Christian Atsu was still the celebrated man of his club Hatayspor on Sunday 5 February by crowning himself the match winner against Kasimpasa with a utilized free kick in extra time, the world was shocked a day later by the disastrous earthquake in Turkey and Syria. It soon became clear that Christian Atsu was amongst the many missing people, leading to fears for the worst. Vitesse have followed the developments in Turkey with concern and fear. As time progressed, hopes for positive news grew smaller and smaller. It is terrible and unbelievable that the last bit of hope has now also disappeared.

Christian Atsu Twasam was born on January 10, 1992 in Ada Foah, a town on the southeast coast of Ghana. The talented attacker made the crossing to Portugal at the age of seventeen, in particular to FC Porto. After 31 official matches for the club from the Portuguese port city and just as many games as a loan player for Rio Ave FC, Christian Atsu signed a contract with Chelsea in 2013. The London superpower first sent the Ghanaian international on a rental basis at Vitesse, before he was also loaned to Everton, AFC Bournemouth, Málaga CF and Newcastle United. With the latter club, Christian Atsu then acted for four seasons on the backdrop of the Premier League, his dream level. He also played the most matches



for 'The Magpies': 121 matches. After his period in England, Christian Atsu ended up at Hatayspor via Saudi Arabia (Al-Raed). He played football at the Turkish club since last summer. Christian Atsu is a sixty-time international from Ghana.

At Vitesse, people were able to enjoy Christian Atsu in the 2013|2014 season. As a footballer, but also as a person. There was no question that he was a technically skilled attacker with a great left leg. In total the Ghanaian noted thirty official games, six goals and five assists in the Vitesse shirt which he has always worn with pride. Thanks to his strong





performance in Arnhem, Christian Atsu was voted Player of the Year after the season by the supporters (association) of Vitesse.



But as mentioned Christian Atsu also impressed off the pitch. Within the club one can only find positive words for him. He had a warm and friendly personality and was always there for everyone. Ask Marko Meerits, for example, the Estonian goalkeeper who was always allowed to drive with Atsu to the training center at Papendal.

After he left Vitesse, Christian Atsu always remained committed to the club. The attacker really saw Vitesse as the fertile soil from which the rest of his career could grow. His warm involvement took shape on July 30, 2015, when he and his friend (and also

former Vitesse player) Bertrand Traoré were present as devoted spectator at Southampton vs Vitesse, in the preliminary round of the Europa League. Weeks before this game Christian Atsu asked for tickets, because he was so eager to see his former teammates. Together with Traoré he also visited the players' hotel after the game where it immediately became cozy as usual.

Christian Atsu also showed his good heart and commitment to Vitesse during the recent pandemic. In the summer of 2020 the former Vitesse player bought ten season tickets for families who were having a bit of a (financial) struggle. "This was the easiest decision for me. I didn't have to think about this for a second; I am so happy to be able to give something back to my old club and its supporters. This was the only right thing to do."

Christian Atsu said at the time. Vitesse will forever cherish its esteemed former player.

Vitesse are shocked by the terrible news. Two players of the current squad have played together with Christian

Atsu. The team has been wearing black armbands in memory of Christian at the away match against FC Volendam on Saturday February 18. At this game Vitesse fans and players showed a banner out of respect for Christian Atsu.

We wish Christian's family and friends a lot of strength with the great loss.

During the Sunday Services or evening conventions, whenever Atsu and his friends were in attendance, you will notice them during the praise and worship session when he Atsu will lead his entourage in dancing to give praises to God.

Atsu was not only a dancer in the house of God, he was part of the ushering team at the Lighthouse Chapel International, King of Kings Cathedral. His favorite part of ushering work, was cleaning the church on Saturdays in preparation for Sunday service. He would often join in sweeping and mopping the floor while singing his favorite praises song to God.

This he continued even after he became a renowned footballer for - Chelsea, Newcastle and the Black Stars of Ghana.

On one occasion when he was cleaning, a visiting pastor noticed him as a familiar person, but was not sure if it could be the famous Christian Atsu involved in cleaning of the church on a Saturday.

The pastor tried to find out by asking his name and in his humble voice and smiling face surprised the pastor by confirming he was Christian Atsu, the footballer!

Whenever Atsu visited Ghana, he attended a service or two at his church, the King of Kings Cathedral.

On many occasions he invited his friends, Black Stars team mates, to come with him to church.

Atsu, your church, Ghanaians and many well meaning people joined in praying for your life when the earthquake happened. We trusted that you will be spared.

But here we are saying goodbye to you.

Like the many friends, families and people impacted by this disaster, we are still struggling to accept what has happened and feel tremendous sadness at the devastating loss of life. We empathise with all those grieving for their lost ones. Our deepest condolences are with Christian's family, wife, children and many friends and lives that he touched.

Christian Atsu was a truly unique and wonderful man, and his legacy will live on through the many hundreds if not thousands of lives he has helped. He will live in our memories as one of the kindest, most talented, humble people to enter this world. A young boy from poverty in Ghana who followed his dreams had an incredibly successful footballing career and used his talent and platform to help others.

Arms Around The Child were fortunate to have known Christian and will treasure his support for the children we look after, especially the children in Senya Beraku where Christian was building a school in the local community. Christian believed in giving children a brighter future and the opportunity to succeed. He never forgot his own roots and didn't want to see any more children abused, imprisoned, affected by HIV, trafficked or sold. He was determined to use his prominence as a footballer to prevent this. He had also been supporting The Crime Check Foundation in Ghana with their work paying fines for petty crimes which had resulted in incarceration, and helping people reintegrate into society and get back on their feet.

Christian has been the global ambassador for Arms Around The Child since 2016. During that time, he visited the children at our home in Senya Beraku, Ghana on many occasions. He regularly organised for gifts and football equipment to be sent to the home and developed a very close relationship with the kids. In 2018 Christian and Arms Around The Child launched a campaign to build a new school in Senya to benefit orphaned children and the local community. Together Arms Around The Child and Christian organized the Black Star Gala, a special fundraising event at the Hilton Hotel in Gateshead, Newcastle, to kickstart the fundraising effort for a new school.

Whenever Christian visited Senya, the children and the community were always so happy to see him. They would welcome him like a hero, but also like a father, uncle or brother as everyone felt such a close affection for him. He greeted everyone with smiles and hugs, making each individual, child and adult, feel important and that they could dream and succeed in life. Christian loved the children and would always throw his shoes off to play barefoot football with them, something he loved to do whenever he visited. The children looked up to him, he showed them that they can have dreams for a better future and that through education, dreams can be achieved. This is why Christian was so passionate about building a school, he believed in education for all, especially as a way to solve problems and give kids a brighter future.





Christian was the main benefactor of the new school buildings in Senya. He always wanted to know how the children were doing and we would regularly update him on the progress of the school, which after years of building is finally nearing completion. On Saturday 4th Feb 2023, just one day before his final game in which he scored a last-minute winning goal, he responded 'Thank you for the update. I will arrange some money so that we will be able to complete it fast, I am very happy with the progress.' Later in the day, he emailed again to say that he would come to open the school in June and bring his Black Star friends. This was our last correspondence with Christian; as always, he was thinking about the children and what he could do to help others.

The director of our home in Senya Beraku, Seth Asiedu had this message on behalf of all the children for Christian and his family:

'Our hearts are broken by the news regarding our beloved bro, Christian Atsu. We always felt the impact of his presence and were soaked with joy any time he visited us. He brought a lot of smiles and happiness to Becky's Home family at Senya Beraku in Ghana through Arms Around The child.

We called him our father, our friend, brother, uncle, sponsor and hero. You have left a great footprint through your generous act that no one can erase. We love you Christian Atsu. We are proud of you, and we are eternally grateful for the good work you did for us. Rest well.'



Similarly, he paid for the health bills of many others under our Health Check Series.

Atsu also understood the power of education; he supported 5 brilliant but needy students through the foundation's Educational Support Fund.

Atsu, my son, your sudden demise has caused much pain and sorrow to me personally and to the Cheetah family at large. We cannot comprehend the fact that such a strong and energetic man can disappear from among us like an early morning mist. Indeed, death is a heart breaker and home wrecker.

Atsu, as he was commonly known and called, I never thought I would see the day, I would be writing a tribute for son. My heart is saddened and my spirit aches. As your father in sports, all I ever wanted to do was protect you at all times but I couldn't.

In 2007, I was engaged by a FIFA Accredited agency called Ramp Management based in Canada as a Chief Scout for their organization. Fast forward, in January, 2008 the team officially informed me of their visit to Ghana. My job was to scout for under 17 players in Ghana and organize a match for them to watch when they arrive. I did scout some players from across the country and organize a match against Feyenoord now known as WAFA at their base in Fetteh in the central region of Ghana. Ramp Management came down with Parlo Cardoso, who was then the chief scout of Sporting Lisbon and Graham Heydorn, the Project Manager for Ramp Management. Christian Atsu, who was then playing for **Feyenoord** was spotted by us just some few minutes of play together with other three boys from the newly recruit. Sporting Lisbon later sent invitation the four players selected but unfortunately, Christian Atsu was denied of honoring the invitation from his club. Later in the year I persuaded his team to sell Christian Atsu to my football club known as Cheetah FC and after a year and half of successful negotiation Christian was released to **Cheetah Football Club**.

Immediately, Christian got to Cheetah FC, he was introduced to **FC Porto**. They quickly expressed interest and invited him for trials. All documentations was completed and Christian by the Grace of God had to leave to Portugal for his trials. On the 20th of January, 2010, before his flight took off to Portugal, he sent me a text message and I quote "I appreciate all you have done for me, thank you. As I embark on this journey, I will like to assure you that, I will not return back, I will surely succeed on this trial. I am going to play football to the highest level, the whole world will hear of my name Christian Atsu Twasam. I will make you proud, I will make myself proud." Almost a week after, FC Porto expressed interest in signing Atsu.





It is worth mentioning that, Atsu actually donated all his three month salary received from FC Porto to a church, right behind the Cheetah FC camp. These moneys was sent to me by western union with specific instructions from Atsu, when I asked why he was giving all the money out to the church, his answer was that, he entered an agreement with God that, after the trials, if he succeeds he will give all his three months' salary to that particular church.

It saddens me to say that, I was with Atsu to see him board his first flight to Europe and also witness his last flight from Europe to receive his body, this was not how we all wanted it to be but however Allah in his own wisdom, knows best and I pray he grant him a place in Heaven.

Son, Your characteristic way of calling me " **Mr. Yartey"** will forever ring in my ears.

The morning of February 12<sup>th</sup> was so cold when I was called and given the news of your untimely death, while reminiscing on fond memories we had.

My son, you were the type of person that always loved helping people. You worked behind the scenes in people's favor without asking for anything in returns. You were always giving a helping hand to everyone you came in contact with and were willing to give your last to help make someone else's life better.

I would like to thank the Divine Lord for allowing me share this lifetime with you as your father.

What makes me so proud was, you didn't allow wealth and fame change your sense of humbleness, you served humanity and the world heard the name **CHRISTIAN ASTU TWASAM** just as promised

For me, Christian was a Christian, he was an angel on earth, and he was truly a son of God.

We have really lost a great and a wonderful person.

We may bid you farewell today but the utmost assurance is that you will forever remain in our hearts. Atsu we love you.


