Biography of the late MRS. MARY BOAKYE-YIADOM

(NEE AYISI)

Mrs. Mary Boakye Yiadom (Nee Ayisi) was born on 29th January, 1962 at Kumikrom, a farming community near Asamankese in the Upper Akyem District of the Eastern Region to Mr. Emmanuel Kofi Nyinaku Ayisi (Deceased) and Madam Gladys Yaa Nsemi Anim all of Adukrom - Akuapem. She started her early education at the Quartey Memorial Preparatory School, Accra New Town and later continued at the St. John's Primary School, Accra New Town from 1968 – 1974.

Brilliant as she was, Mary Ayisi (then known) sat for the Common Entrance Examination in 1974, passed and gained admission to Abuakwa State Collage (ABUSCO), Kyebi in the Eastern Region, in the same year. Whilst at St John's Primary School, Mary was a sportswoman par excellence and led the school netball team to beat all the other schools at Accra New Town.

The Late Mrs. Boakye Yiadom did not abandon her sporting activities whilst at ABUSCO.

She sat for her Ordinary Level (GCE O' Level) Examination in her Arts subjects in the year 1979. She bettered some of her grades at the Accra Workers College (now University of Ghana City Campus) and came out successfully. Whilst preparing for her Sixth Form Education,

Mr. Anokye Boakye Yiadom (then a businessman) came her way with a marriage proposal which she agreed to. They got married in the year 1980, a union which was blessed with ten (10) children.

Mary Ayisi joined her late husband in his business enterprise which was later transformed into Real Estate business here in Accra. Their enterprise continued to boom with a lot of persons benefitting from their handiworks.

The late Mary Boakye Yiadom continued to support her husband in all spheres of his life and the two lived together until death took them away. The husband in August 2018.

Notwithstanding the setback, she continued to play her role as a mother to her children and combined it with her church responsibilities especially with the Women Ministry of the Pentecost International Worship Center (PIWC) at Atomic, where she and her husband worshipped.

This was an example to all of us.



Our mother, our friend, our confidant, our most prayerful one, we miss you dearly.
























TRIBUTE BY SIBLINGS TO THE LATE

Your love for your younger siblings and other kids was so amazing that it attracted your peers and elders in the community in which we lived.

Occasionally, you would take one or two of us to visit your female friends whenever you are on vacation whilst at Abuakwa State College, Kibi.

Though you left early to your marital home, you kept in touch with us as expected. The bonding grew stronger even after the demise of your husband. Your response was so encouraging and pleasant anytime we visit you. This will continue to be in our memories for a very long time.

It is unfortunate we have suddenly lost a sister whom we prayed and hoped for that she would recover and live long to attend to her children, grandchildren and family members.

The news of your passing on came as a shock and surprise as none of us had expected that you would depart this world at this moment to meet your maker.

TO THE LATE DEACONESS MARY BOAKYE-YIADOM (MRS)

"And now, dear brothers and sisters, we want you to know what will happen to the believers who have died so you will not grieve like people who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and was raised to life again, we also believe that when Jesus returns, God will bring back with him the believers who have died."

(1 Thessalonians 4:13-14)

Our records indicate that Deaconess (Mrs) Mary Boakye-Yiadom Deaconess accepted Christ and was baptized in water by immersion in 1979 by Pastor Parker then of the Accra New Town District of The Church of Pentecost. She worshiped in the district for the greater part of her adult life and where she also got married to her late husband, Nana Anokye Boakye-Yiadom in December 1980.

When the three English Assemblies in Accra (including Kokomlemle) were amalgamated into the Accra International Worship Centre in 1993 (subsequently to become Pentecost International Worship Centre - Accra), Mrs Mary Boakye-Yiadom became a foundation member. In October 2008, when PIWC-Accra was split into two, she was one of the few members that opted to form the nucleus of PIWC-Atomic.

At the time, various structures were being put in place in the new centre and Deaconess Boakye-Yiadom was active in joining forces with other ladies in ensuring that the Women's Ministry was made attractive to all women, especially the young ladies. In July 2010, Mrs. Mary Boakye-Yiadom was ordained a Deaconess of the church by Apostle Ephraim Barabu, then Area Head for Madina. In spite of the fact that she had a large growing family, Deaconess Mary Boakye-Yiadom did not allow her family life to affect her activism in church activities.

She did her best to be regular and punctual for Sunday Celebration Services.

On Lord's Supper Sundays in particular, she came in early and will quickly assist her colleagues to ensure that the preparation of the elements was promptly done before taking her seat.

Deaconess Mary Boakye-Yiadom was a regular participant in the church's mid-week Prayer Service ('KRATOS') as well as other week-long services among others.

She was also very active in the activities of the Women's Ministry, the church's home cell system and Redemption Hour Prayer Meetings.


